Footnote

"Tunaley, Thomas" appointed member of the Royal Agricultural Society of England - Derby Mercury 31 May 1843 Whilst a number of newspaper notices have been discovered featuring the horticultural interests of the early Tunaleys, all but one of these articles refer either to "Tunaley" or "W. Tunaley", the latter presumably being William Tunaley (b. 1802).

The notice in the Derby Mercury 31 May1843 however does refer to "Tunaley Thomas, Derby". This item could of course refer to any one of the three Thomas Tunaleys living at the time, viz. Thomas Snr., Thomas Jnr., or, of course, Thomas Snape Tunaley.
